Families are rapidly becoming the fastest growing segment of the homeless population in our country. The typical homeless family in Arizona consists of a single mother with two or three young children. Many are the victims of domestic violence. When a family becomes homeless or is living in poverty, so are the children. The children are moved from place to place, living with various family members, in cars, or in a local park. This transient lifestyle often causes trauma that leads to low self-esteem and poor health. The problem is too often perpetuated into the next generation.

Now more than ever the need for services provided by UMOM New Day Centers is at an all-time high. A new subset of homeless families has formed due to job loss and foreclosures. As a result, our waiting list has grown to as much as 120 families. Now more than ever - your help is required to meet the basic needs of our community's less fortunate children and families.

Since 1964, UMOM New Day Centers

has been committed to our mission of changing lives and helping families get a new start. UMOM provides Arizona's homeless and low-income families with the food, shelter and tools they need to build a bridge to self-sufficiency. Through HELP, UMOM's capital campaign, we will meet the needs of an additional 44 families every day. With your help, UMOM is remodeling two well maintained hotel buildings located on seven acres directly across the street from our current location. Phase II of our HELP Capital Campaign will allow us to finish the initiative begun back in 2005 and we are looking forward to serving families from the new facility in Summer 2009. After our families and operations are relocated across the street, we will demolish all of the severely aging facilities we currently occupy and we will construct an initial 80 affordable housing units where families can take the final step towards self-sufficiency.

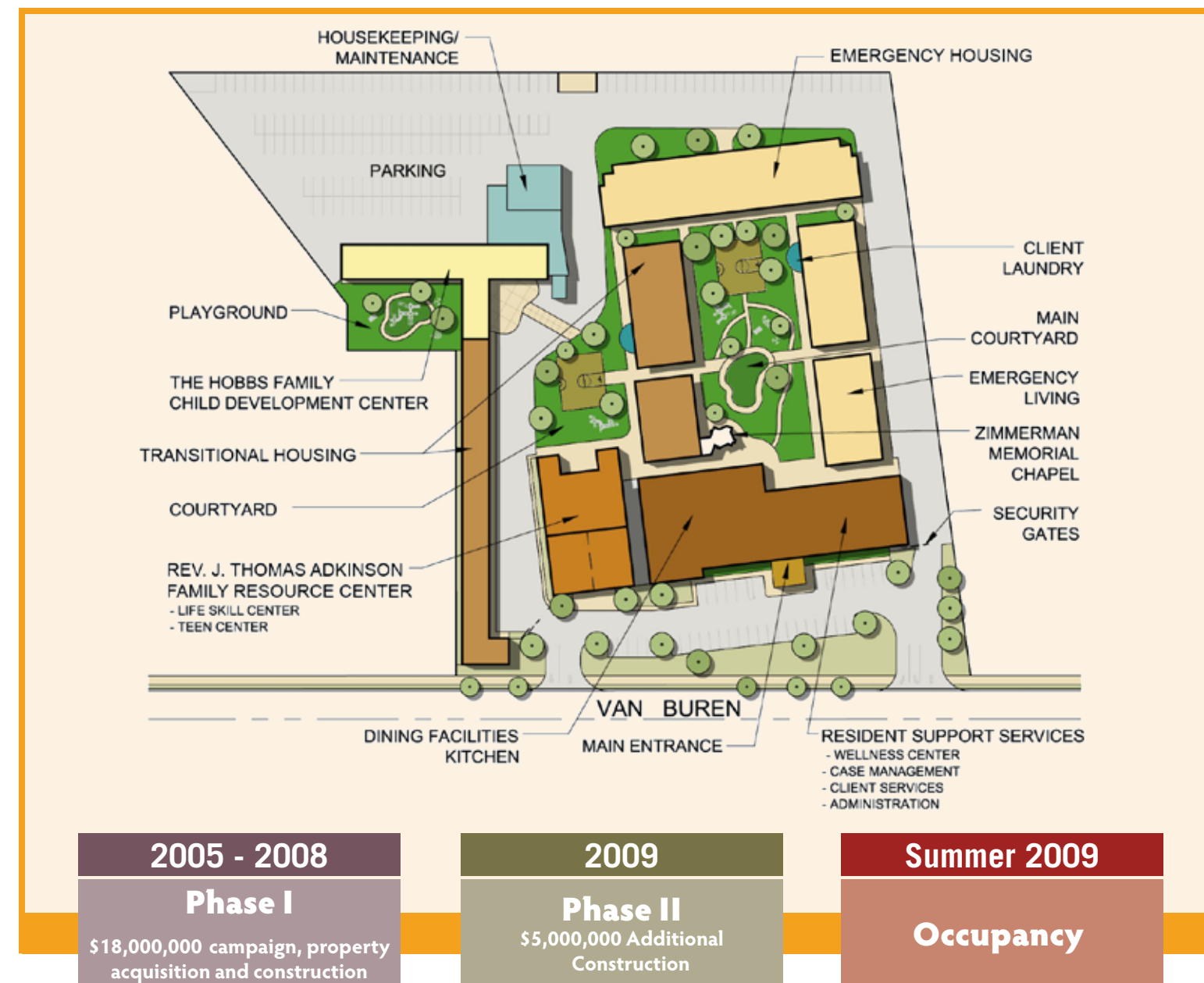

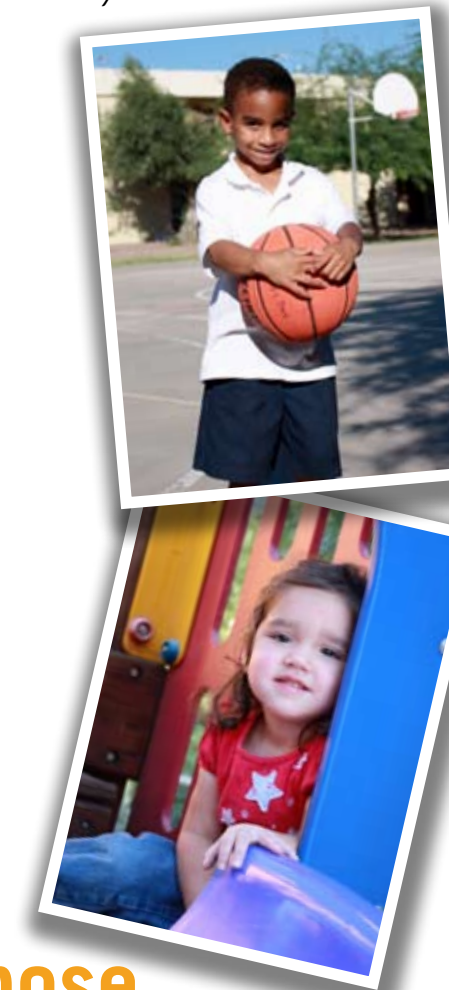
